In recent years, large-scale disasters have occurred not only in Japan but all over the world. The importance and necessity of support activities aimed at rehabilitation, daily life support, and prevention of secondary disabilities for the elderly and disabled people who need support in the event of a disaster has come to be recognized. In Japan, a rehabilitation-related organization launched The Japan Disaster Rehabilitation Assistance Team (JRAT) in 2013, and the team conducts support activities for disaster victims and areas during disasters.
